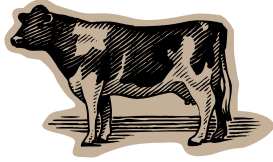


Social Report

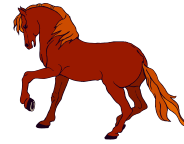
